# GREENWICH BY THE NUMBERS

- **63,518 Greenwich residents (2020 census).**
- **16,218 Greenwich residents under the age of 18 (nonvoters).**
- **40,532 Registered Voters (as of August 2022).**
  - 85% of adult voters are registered (virtual 100%)
  - 39% Unaffiliated
  - 30% Democrat
  - 29% Republican
  - 1% Other (Green, Libertarian, independent)
- **Turnout in Presidential and Federal/State election years is high.**
  - 79.8% in 2020
  - 71.25% in 2018
  - 76.94% in 2016
- **Turnout in local municipal election years is very low.**
  - 35% turnout in 2021
  - 33% turnout in 2019
  - 30% turnout in 2017
  - This means that a small minority of energized voters – as low as 20% -- will determine what policies are made and passed. This can have a huge effect on local services, like schools.

- **2023 – Municipal Elections -- off year, and every uneven year**

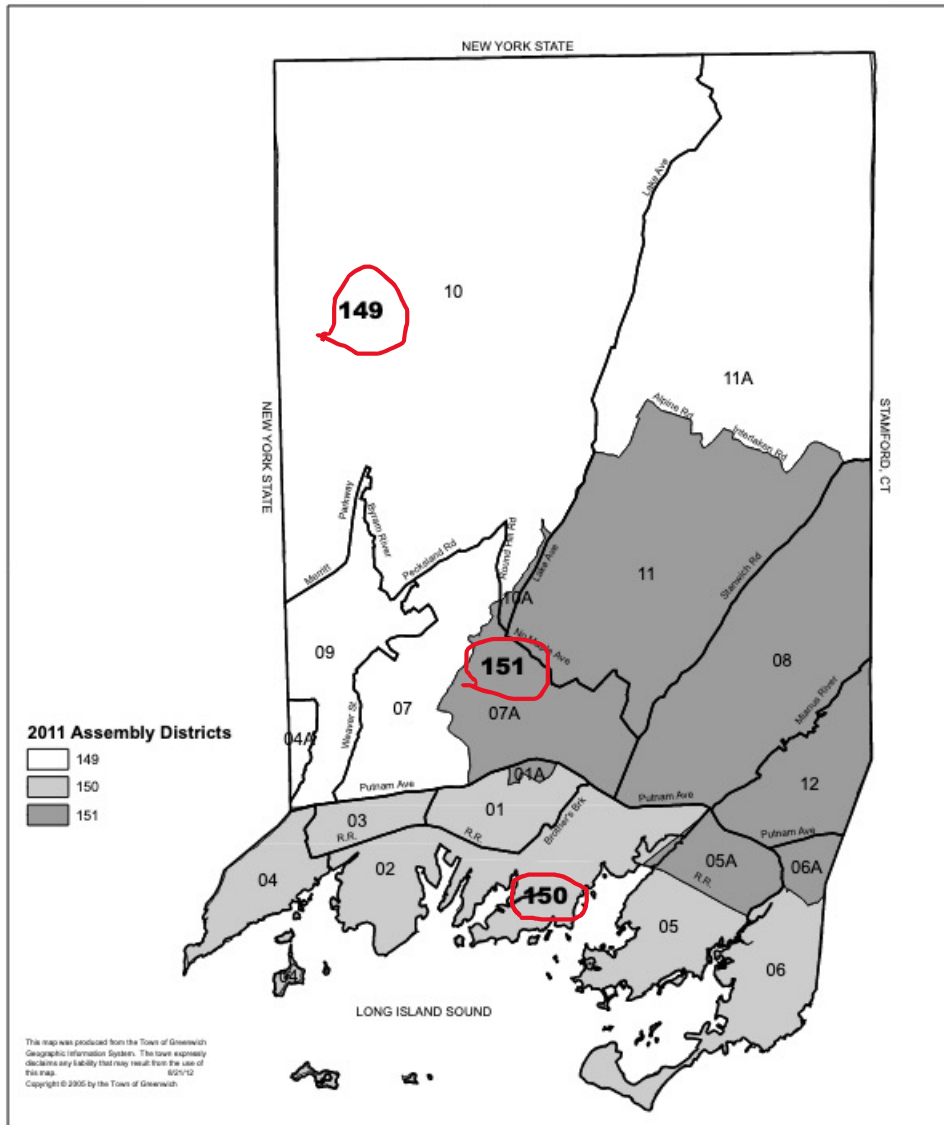

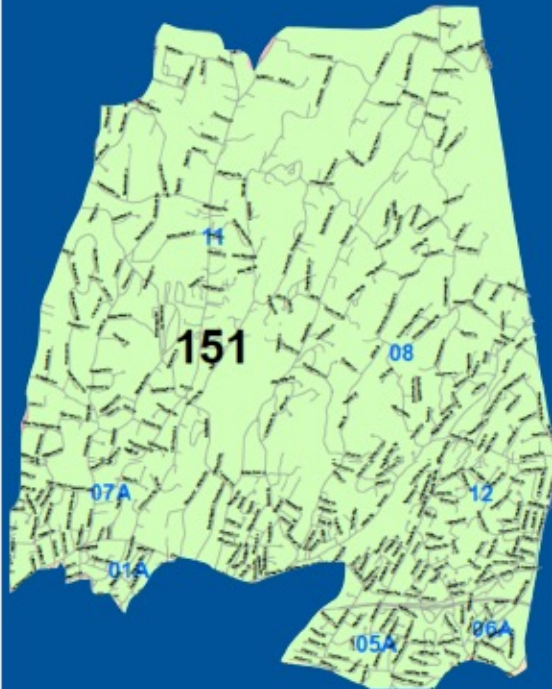

## DO!

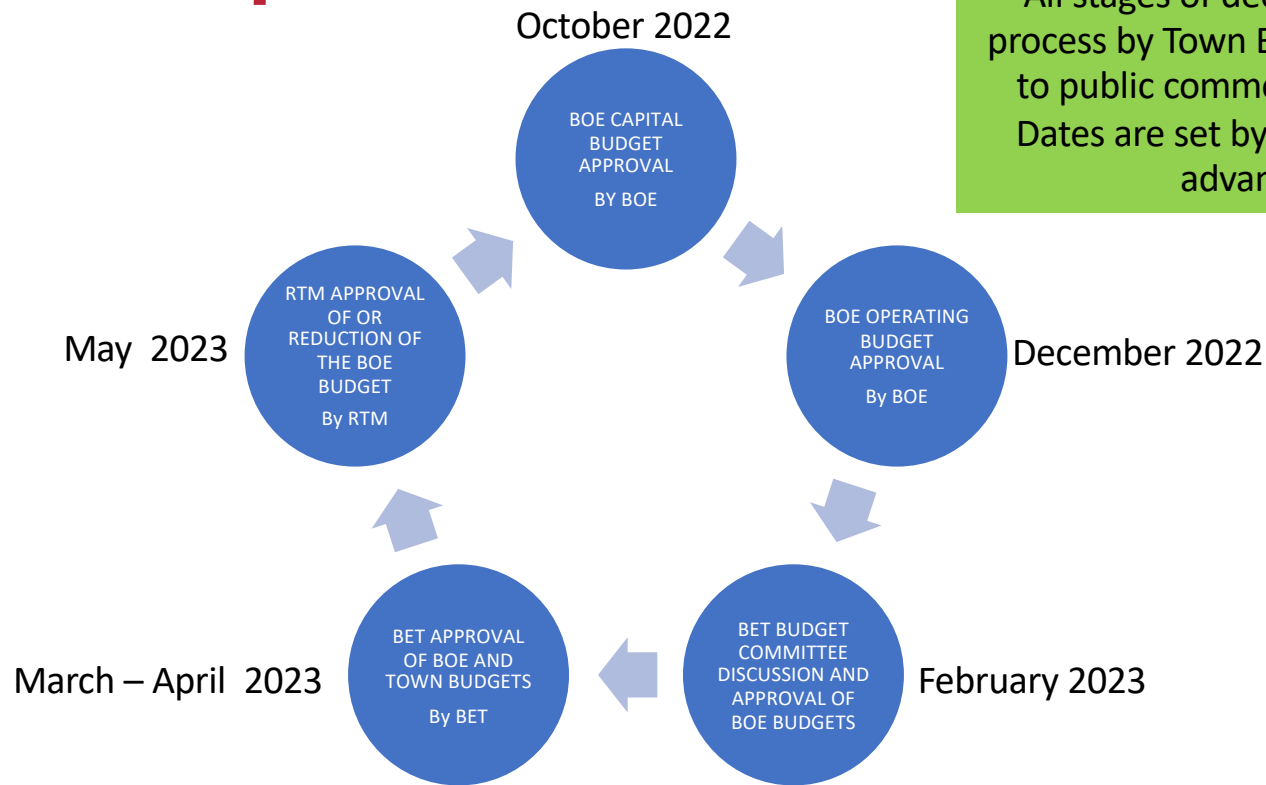
- Go to [www.Vote411.org](http://www.Vote411.org):
