Event Report: December 2017

Executive Summary

The Participants

- 100 people participated in the case study event and 66 responded to the survey.
- o Participants were about 2/3 female and 1/3 male.
- o The three largest group affiliations were Greenwich High School (29%), League of Women Voters (27%) and Brunswick/Greenwich Academy (23%).
- The two largest age cohorts were 50+ (48%) and Under 25 (40%)

The Invitation and Reasons for Attending

- Attendees were predominately invited by their affiliated organizations.
- Their main reasons for attending were:
 - interest in US history and the Constitution,
 - a desire to participate in a Harvard case study class, and
 - the political relevance of the issue (federal vs. state power) today.

Assessment of Pre-Reading and Event

- Almost all participants viewed the pre-reading assignment favorably.
- Virtually all of those attending said they:
 - enjoyed the case study method of teaching,
 - would attend future events like this one,
 - would recommend the event to a friend, and
 - would recommend that other teachers, schools and civic groups adopt this method of teaching.


Executive Summary

Assessment of Case Facilitation

Professor Moss received top 2 box scores from 98% of attendees.

Impact and Follow-Up

- Seven of nine additional cases from Democracy: A Case Study received a majority vote for a future case discussion event.
- As a result of attending the discussion:
 - Seven out of ten participants said they would be much more likely to approach future political discussions more constructively, especially when presented with an opposing point of view.
 - Half said they would be much more likely to vote in government elections.
 - Just under half said they would be much more likely to get involved in politics.
 - About a quarter said they would be much more likely to consider running for political office.



About the Attendees


Greenwich High School and the League of Women Voters represented the two largest groups in attendance.


- There was almost an even split between public and private school attendance.



Demographics


- ► Attendance was split about 2/3 female and 1/3 male

Most attendees were invited by the organization they are affiliated with.




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MOTIVATION TO ATTEND

Motivation to Attend


Attendees were motivated primarily by an **interest** in history and the Constitution, followed equally by a desire to **participate** in a Harvard case study about a politically **relevant** issue.

Evaluation of The Pre-Reading Assignment


Almost all participants viewed the pre-reading assignment **very positively**.

Evaluation of The Case Study


Overall, the case study method was very positively received with almost all attendees willing to attend a similar event in the future and recommend it to others.

As a Result of Participation, Likelihood to...


- Seven out of ten participants said they would be much more likely to approach future political discussions more constructively, especially when presented with an opposing point of view.


